## First Fridays

Imagine what it would look like for hundreds of believers coming together in fasting and agreeing prayer on a specific day of the month, each month, on the first Friday. Imagine how such a day each month would clearly demonstrate our solidarity and seriousness to God as we fast and prayer about the same things. Imagine the combined weight of agreeing and praying together to ignite a fresh movement of the Holy Spirit in our day. **Believing that prayer is the ignition source of all Spirit-fueled movements let us join in prayer beginning on Friday, May 6.**

On these days, schedule some

specific time to go into your prayer room and close the door. Pray to your Father in heaven. Consider asking a friend or small group of believers to join with you in group prayer. This can be done anywhere and at any time in person or on a zoom call.

Decide in advance, what meal(s) you will fast to give more time to focused prayer. Please note that fasting is not recommended for those whom it is not medically allowed. It is important to stay hydrated during your fast.

Fasting is a willingness to experience physical hunger to demonstrate our spiritual hunger for God to move in fresh ways among His people.

What should we pray for? Ask the Lord to bless the plan for our futures. What will the future for our two churches look like? Will we operate as one or two? How will we prepare and how should we approach discussions with one another?

Ask God for humble spirits, teachable and open minds and compassionate and forgiving hearts. Pray that the Spirit of God would dwell with us, fill us, and baptize us with His presence.

I am so filled with gratitude for Grand Avenue and First. I read the kind words on the birthday cards, and I choke up. However, I am equally excited and grateful for our future. I pray you are too.

# Youth Ministry

Recently, I was scrolling through different television programs, and I landed on a sports station that was airing the Boston Marathon. Immediately, I was drawn into this amazing spectacle taking place. I was impressed by all the participants as they ran with vigor and enthusiasm. Some were fast, others not so much. Step by step, they made their way down streets that inclined and declined and turned left and right, all the while fans stood on the sidewalks waving signs and cheering on the participants. Watching the race, it was clear to see how difficult running a marathon is. As one person or two would accelerate and others slowed down, they kept pushing and the runners never quit. They sweat from the strain they faced, and it was obvious that their bodies hurt, but step by step they ran until they crossed the finish line.

After watching the Boston Marathon, it was easy to draw comparisons to the Christian faith and the moments of difficulty that arise at times. In fact, most of you know that God's Word has moments where it compares our daily Christian walk with running a race and finishing strong. It implores us to continue the journey of following Christ even when times become difficult and including when doubtful thoughts tell us everything would be easier if we gave up and walked away.

Observing churches in the West, particularly post pandemic, it is evident that many people have not returned to the churches they once frequently attended, and this includes our church as well. Some of these individuals have become accustomed to watching church services online. Others have filled their Sunday mornings with other activities. There are also the few that have decided for one reason or

another that church is no longer relevant in their lives. Be aware that I said, "Church is no longer relevant." I did not say, "God." As there are many people who no longer attend church but still are followers of Christ. Whatever the case may be, we must be honest with ourselves that church attendance is declining and relationships between Christians who were once dedicated participants with their local church are being affected negatively.

So, what do we do about this issue? Our church council has been meeting weekly doing our best to try to answer that simple, yet mysterious question. We are faithfully praying, reading God's Word, and at times fasting, trying to discover God's plan for our church family. We all know that something must be done, but we want that, "Something," to be what God desires for us. After each meeting with our council, I grow more confident that God has some mighty plans for our congregation.

You may be wondering what you can do during this time, and

that is a great question. I ask that you pray alongside our council, and pray for our council, as we strive to make the correct decisions for our church. I encourage you to share any concerns you have regarding the state of our church with the council as well. We want to hear from you. Each one of you are important members of our church family and your voice matters. You can also reach out to people you've noticed who have not returned to church in awhile and give them an invitation to rejoin us on Sunday mornings or to a special event. Your invitation may be the difference the person was needing.

Lastly, I encourage you to continue the race. Keep running, placing one foot in front of the other. Times may get hard, but hard times create good character. If you feel the race has become too difficult, reach out to a Christian brother or sister and request a helping hand, as we all need help at times. May God bless you on this beautiful race we're running.

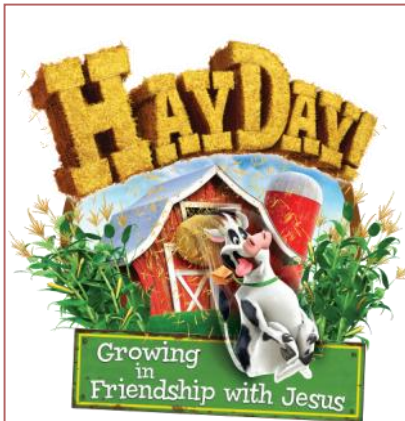

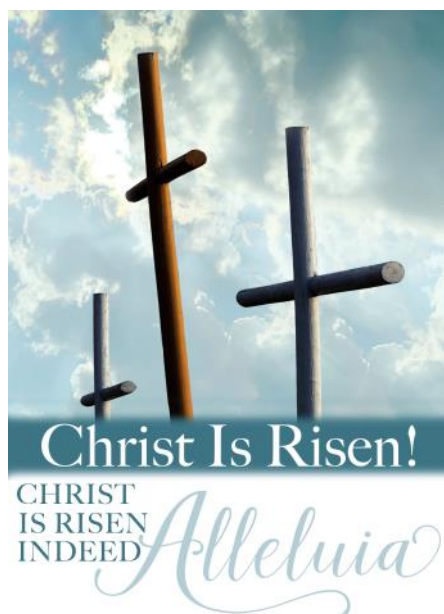
